Kirkhamgate Assist Foodbank Project

Our School Parliament children have collectively asked that the Academy supports a local charity by donating some basic food hampers to those most vulnerable in our community.

We chose Kirkhamgate Community Association and the 'Kirkhamgate Assist' program with the support and help of Rev. Drost. The assist program will be delivering food hampers to older members of our village and wider community who live alone.



The hampers are to be made up on 12th December and delivered on the 13th by the Community Association. The School Parliament are therefore asking for any donations from our children and their families to be brought to school no later than Wednesday 9th December.

The children will create drop boxes and place them in sheltered locations around the outside of the academy where donations can be left between Wednesday 2nd December and Wednesday 9th December at the start of the school day. Please be mindful of social distancing measures that are in place to keep our children and families safe when making any donations.

Ideally the completed festive hampers will include:-

- Tinned chicken
- Small pack of crackers
- Jar of jam
- Christmas cards, Calendars and any other Christmas decoration
- Shortbread biscuits
- Gourmet crisps
- Christmas cake
- Custard
