### Project Idea

Our Geography focus this half-term is rural and urban areas and we will be studying William Morris in art and Living things in their habitats in Science. You can choose what you want to do for your topic homework and how you want to present it, but here are some suggestions to get you started.

**Maths-** Create a graph on creatures found in the local area.

**English-** Write a poem about vertebrates and invertebrates

**Science-** Create a classification key to classify Living Things.

**Art-** Create William Morris inspired wallpaper masterpiece or maybe some stained glass or tiles.

**DT-** Create a model showing the life cycle of a living thing.

**Geography-** Create a map illustrating key parts of Wakefield/your local area.

**History-** Research the life of William Morris and present to the class.

**MFL-** Find out the french words for a variety of plants and animals and illustrate.

**Music-** If you play an instrument, why not create a piece of music inspired by an animal.

**PE-** Invent a game for PE involving being different animals finding their best habitat to survive.

**Computing-** Create a PPT presentation/website about Living Things.
